Hessian Barracks - a place where Mercenaries fighting for England were housed; Mt. Olivet Cemetary - final resting place of Francis Scott Key, Barbara Fritchie, Thomas Jefferson and other famous Fredericktonians; the National Museum of Civil War Medicine - the only institution of its kind in existence today; the Community Bridge - an amazing trompel'oeil (fool the eye) wonder. Frederick also has antiques, shopping, art and culture, dining, parks and recreation, orchards and farms, wineries and breweries.

Interstate 2000 will be based at the newly remodeled Holiday Inn Fort Detrick, located at the interstection of US Route 40 & 15, just a short distance from downtown Frederick.

Friday and Saturday dinners include a Western BarBQ(dress appropriately) and a roast beef buffet. Breakfast will be on your own, either at the hotel or at any of the many restaurants along "Golden Mile".

Tours will include downtown Historic Frederick and surrounding area. Sunday vespers and sendoff will be followed by Maryland's Annual Conference-Initiation and Consecration Service at the Holiday Inn. Look for further details in the future.
